7	OAC Chapter 3745-35 Registrations do not require revocations. For example, the operations change to make the emissions unit exempt or de minimis	Mike Ahern
8	<p>Do PBRs transfer to a new owner the way permits do? How does the web page get updated? Does the company have to submit a new form? If so, does the DO/LAA have to enter it as a new PBR?</p> <p>1. Once a site has obtained PBR status, that status or (Permit by Rule) is in fact transferrable, just like a traditional PTIO, correct? There are folks (new owners) currently searching the web site to see if their site is PBR, but the application that retrieves the data from STARS2 to the web must not be capturing information on the ownership change/facility name change. This leads facilities to believe they need to re-apply to get their new name up on the web.</p> <p>I need to know what happens with posting PBRs to the web page in terms of posting so that we can determine if changes need to be made. I am guessing that the districts don't need to enter a NEW PBR application for ownership change only because that should not be required.</p> <p>2. I have heard of DO/LAAs stating PBRs are not transferrable and requesting new PBR forms. My feeling is that we should tell sites they are in fact transferrable but we are using the PBR form (new ownership option) to capture the new information. What information should I be relaying to DO/LAAs?</p>	Elisa Thomas/ Mike Hopkins

10	<p>How should DO/LAAs be implementing the last paragraph of the law that requires that sources with a PTE of greater than 10 tons per year of NOx or VOC be subject to "any applicable RACT rule in effect as of January 1, 2006, regardless of the location of the source."? Is this similar to the way that the Air Toxics Law is being cited, in that the statute is the applicable rule / authority for term and limitations from the RACT rule are then included in the T&C?</p> <p>Since the NOx RACT was effective after January 1, 2006, the assumption is that the law prohibits the inclusion of NOx RACT requirements. However, several of the VOC RACT rules were effective prior to this date and therefore may be included where applicable.</p>	Mike Hopkins
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
