Dear Mr. Jacobs:

Thank you for your December 9, 2010, letter and January 17, 2011, follow-up response to Ohio EPA's November 1, 2010 Notice of Violation letter. You provided evidence of corrections related to:

1. **Container Accumulation Start Date Marking, OAC rule 3745-52-34(A)(2):** The 300-gallon tote containers for waste solvent in the resin plant have been properly marked with date tags. The buckets of hazardous waste unusable stain were shipped to a TSD facility on 9/28/2010. The contents of two blue steel 55-gallon drums of "dirty thinner" were transferred to Tank 126.
2. **Accumulation Container Marking, OAC rule 3745-52-34(A)(3):** The drum of paint in the R&D lab, a 5 gallon bucket in the Paint Plant QC lab, and the containers mentioned under violation #1 above were all now corrected.
3. **Open Containers, OAC rule 3745-66-73(A):** Tote containers for waste solvent in the paint plant have been fitted with lids that close adequately. A drum in the paint development lab has been fitted with a latching funnel, and another drum of latex waste was clarified to be non-hazardous.
4. **Universal Waste Lamp Container Management, OAC rule 3745-273-13(D)(1):** The waste lamp tubes were packaged and removed, and procedures put in place to continue proper packaging during accumulation.
5. **Universal Waste Lamp Container Management, OAC rule 3745-273-14(E):** Containers of waste lamps are now marked as "universal waste". [Note: Please ensure that the marking is always specifically one of the following: "Waste Lamps", "Used Lamps", or "Universal Waste Lamps".]

In addition, Yenkin-Majestic provided descriptions of measures taken to improve safe operations at the resin plant plate filter press operations, to prevent releases or spills of material that would become hazardous waste. The contingency plan has been updated with current information, and employee training issues are being kept up with despite some staff turnover, you indicated.

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In summary, Yenkin-Majestic has adequately demonstrated abatement of all violations previously noted at your Leonard Avenue, Columbus facility during the September 9 and 10, 2010 inspection.
