Dear Ms. Tevebaugh:

On August 16, 2007, Ohio EPA conducted inspections of Royster-Clark's Urbana and Hillsboro, Ohio facilities to determine Royster-Clark's compliance with Ohio's Cessation of Regulated Operations (CRO) laws and rules as found under Chapter 3752 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745-352 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). Steve Cundiff represented Royster-Clark. I represented Ohio EPA. Ohio EPA's inspection included a complete walk through of the both facilities and the inspection of remaining stationary items. Based on these inspections, Ohio EPA has determined Royster-Clark has violated the following State CRO regulations:

1. ORC 3752.04 Notice of cessation of regulated operations, ORC 3752.05 Designating contact person for facility, and OAC 3745-352-20(A)(1)(a) and (c). Not later than thirty days after cessation of regulated operations, you must:
 - (a) Submit a notice of cessation of regulated operations to the director, the local emergency planning committee, and the fire department using form EPA 0327.
 - (c) Designate a contact person for the facility in accordance with rule 3745-352-35 of the Administrative Code.

Royster-Clark did not submit the required notification and did not designate a contact person within thirty days of ceasing operations for either facility. Therefore, Royster-Clark is in violation of ORC 3752.04, 3752.05, 3752.07, and OAC 3745-352-20(A)(1)(a-c).

To return to compliance, please submit an EPA form 0327 for each facility to this office within 14 days of receipt of this letter.

2. ORC 3752.07 Securing building, structure or outdoor location against unauthorized entry, OAC 3745-352-20(A)(1)(b), and OAC 3745-352-30(B) and (C), Providing adequate security:

OAC 3745-352-20(A)(1)(b) states that the owner or operator must secure the facility in accordance with rule 3745-352-30, and must maintain this security until you have performed the measures required under paragraphs (A)(2)(d) to (A)(2)(f) of this rule and the director has verified your compliance and has concurred with your certification made under paragraph (A)(2)(g) of this rule.

OAC 3745-352-30(B) states that you must post warning signs in publicly visible locations about each building or structure and each outdoor location of operation. Minimally, you must post warning signs at all facility access locations. You must have enough warning signs to alert persons that the building, structure or outdoor location contains or is contaminated with regulated substances. These warning signs must prohibit trespassing and state: "The building, structure, or outdoor location of operation contains or is contaminated with regulated substances that may endanger public health or safety if released into the environment."

OAC 3745-352-30(C) states that you must maintain entry barriers and warning signs required in paragraphs (A) and (B) of this rule by doing the following:

- (1) You must inspect entry barriers and warning signs at least every seven days, or as agreed upon in writing by the director, the county sheriff's department, or the local police department.
- (2) You must record the condition of each entry barrier, security measure, and warning sign in an inspection log. You must show the log to the director if he requests it; and
- (3) You must repair or replace any damaged, lost, or removed entry barrier, warning sign, or other security measure promptly after you discover it is damaged or missing.

Royster-Clark did not post warning signs or conduct weekly inspections at either facility. Therefore, Royster-Clark violated OAC 3745-352-30(B) and (C). During my inspections on August 16, 2007, I determined that Royster-Clark has performed the measures required under paragraphs (A)(2)(d) and (A)(2)(f), verified your compliance with paragraphs (A)(2)(d) and (A)(2)(f), and concurred with your certifications made under paragraph (A)(2)(g) of this rule. Therefore, Royster-Clark is no longer required to provide the security described above, and is considered to have returned to compliance with these rules.
