Return to Compliance

Dear Mr. Roush:

During the November 1, 2010, meeting and in your letter received on November 9, 2010, you explained that Upper Valley Medical Center (UVMC) has decided to manage all pharmaceutical wastes as hazardous waste. Acutely hazardous wastes (P-listed) will be stored separately from other hazardous pharmaceutical wastes. Based on this information, UVMC has abated the violation discovered during the October 5, 2010, inspection, as listed below:

Ohio Revised Code 3734.02(F)

While there is no regulation against UVMC managing all pharmaceutical wastes as hazardous, there are specific regulations for storage of incompatible wastes. Please be aware of any potentially incompatible wastes that may be placed into the same containers in the pharmacy.

A complete inspection was not conducted on October 5, 2010, because UVMC did not know its hazardous waste generator status. In the future a full compliance evaluation inspection will be conducted to determine UVMC's compliance with all applicable hazardous waste regulations.
