Dear Mr. and Mrs. Jurich:

On June 1, 2010, the Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) met with you and conducted a site visit of the Bohn-Jur site at 5311 Webster Street in Dayton, Ohio. Also present was Mark Lynch, Chief of the Harrison Township Fire Department. The purpose of the visit was to investigate the concerns of the fire department regarding the chemicals being stored onsite. The Ohio EPA was represented by George Strobel, Jeff Smith, and me.

As a result of the investigation, the Ohio EPA has concluded that Bohn-Jur is storing hazardous waste on site. Here is a summary of our observations:

- No manufacturing operations are currently being conducted on site.
- There are numerous containers of waste leaking inside the building.
- Within the building, numerous containers are being stored, including many dip tanks that contain plating wastes.

Based on these findings, Ohio EPA has identified the following initial violation of Ohio's hazardous waste laws:

**Hazardous Waste Determination (OAC 3745-52-11)**

Ohio Administrative Code 3745-52-11 requires that any person generating a waste must evaluate the waste to determine if it is a characteristic or listed hazardous waste. Bohn-Jur has failed to evaluate any of the wastes on site to determine if they are hazardous.

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
In order to begin abating this violation, Bohn-Jur must immediately submit an inventory of all of the chemicals on site **within 10 days of receipt of this letter**. List the quantity, container description, and material description of every chemical that remains on site. Identify which of these materials are a waste, provide a schedule for hazardous waste evaluation and removal, and identify where it will be shipped. For materials that are identified as useable product or raw material, provide a description of what it will be used for and when it will be used.

Submit this inventory **within 10 days of receipt of this letter**.

Ohio EPA is concerned regarding the nature and quantity of materials being stored onsite and the condition of many of the containers. It is therefore important that we receive from you a written response that expresses an intent and ability to conduct the necessary identification and removal of hazardous waste and materials in a timely manner.
