Dear Mr. Amin:

On June 16, 2010, I conducted an inspection of Cleveland Circuits Corporation d.b.a. Instrumatics (Instrumatics) for compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste and used oil regulations. On July 22, 2010, I issued a Notice of Violation letter to Instrumatics that identified the numerous violations I observed and identified the actions that your company must take to return to compliance. Said letter stated that a response was to be submitted to this office within 30 days of the date of receipt of the letter.

On September 9, 2010, I issued, in response to your request received by Ohio EPA on August 31, 2010, an extension-of-time letter to Instrumatics approving a 45-day extension until about October 11, 2010, for the response to Ohio EPA's Notice of Violation letter dated July 22, 2010.

On October 14, 2010, I received Instrumatics' response to Ohio EPA's Notice of Violation letter dated July 22, 2010. On October 28, 2010, I issued a Partial Return to Compliance letter to Instrumatics. Said letter also contained a list of violations for which Instrumatics was not returned to compliance because the response for those violations was inadequate. Said letter stated that a response was to be submitted to this office within 30 days of the date of receipt of the letter.

On December 15, 2010, I received Instrumatics' response to Ohio EPA's Partial Return to Compliance letter dated October 14, 2010. On December 20, 2010, I issued a Second Partial Return to Compliance letter to Instrumatics. Said letter also contained a list of violations for which Instrumatics was not returned to compliance because the response for those violations was still inadequate. Said letter stated that a response was to be submitted to this office within 30 days of the date of receipt of the letter.

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Since sending the December 20, 2010 letter, I have had several phone conversations with Mr. Jeffery Pallotta of Instrumatics regarding the December 20, 2010 letter and have responded to several e-mail requests from Mr. Pallotta for comments on the Instrumatics waste hazardous personnel training program.

I have not yet received a response from Instrumatics to Ohio EPA's Partial Return to Compliance letter dated December 20, 2010. The response is now significantly past due.

A response that adequately addresses actions taken to abate each violation listed as **VIOLATIONS FOR WHICH INSTRUMATICS IS NOT RETURNED TO COMPLIANCE AND WHICH REQUIRE ADDITIONAL ACTION**, in the December 20, 2010 letter, must be submitted to this office no later than 21 days from the date of receipt of this letter. Failure to adequately respond within this timeline may subject Instrumatics to enforcement actions.
