Dear Mr. Musilli:

On December 1, 2009, this writer, representing the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Hazardous Waste Management, conducted a compliance evaluation inspection (CEI) at McHenry Industries located at 592 Industrial Road, Youngstown, Ohio. The facility was inspected to determine its compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC), and the rules promulgated thereunder in Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).

The inspection included a review of the facility's operations, management of wastes, and records. The facility was inspected for the requirements of a conditionally exempt small quantity generator (CESQG) of hazardous waste. However, a review of facility records indicates the facility may have been an episodic small quantity generator of hazardous waste in the past.

Ohio EPA identified the following violations of Ohio's hazardous waste laws. In order to correct the violations and address the concerns listed below, the facility must do the following and send me the requested information **within 30 days** of the date of this letter.

1. Waste Evaluation, OAC rule 3745-52-11:
Any person who generates a waste, as defined in OAC rule 3745-51-02, must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste.

The facility failed to evaluate the contents of paint cans/cups (ensuring they are empty prior to disposal). Cups with residual liquid paint/solvent in them were observed in a trash can. In order for the container to be empty, all waste that can be removed using common practices (pouring, pumping, aspirating, scrapping, etc) must be removed.

In order to abate this violation, the facility must submit a written procedure and/or personnel training record that indicates how the facility will correct this violation. A copy of OAC rule 3745-51-07 (empty container rule) was provide to you during the inspection.

2. Waste Evaluation, OAC rule 3745-52-11:
Any person who generates a waste, as defined in OAC rule 3745-51-02, must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste.

The facility failed to evaluate spent fluorescent lamps prior to disposal.

In order to abate this violation, the facility must submit a procedure that outlines how the spent lamps will be managed. Ohio EPA encourages the facility to manage the lamps in accordance with the universal waste requirements. A guidance document, *Universal Waste Rules for Handlers of Lamps*, and a partial list of lamp recyclers were provided to you during the inspection.

Comments:

3. The facility generates spent paint booth filters. The filters appear to be a non-hazardous waste, but a waste evaluation/profile was not available. **Please inform Ohio EPA how the spent paint booth filters will be managed.**
4. Though not required as a CESQG of hazardous waste, all hazardous waste containers at the facility should be appropriately labeled and closed when not in use. Refer to Ohio EPA's Hazardous Waste Generator Handbook for the proper management of hazardous waste containers.
5. The facility generates spent aerosol cans. In general, the facility must ensure that each can is empty prior to disposal or scrap metal recycling. Information of the proper management of aerosol cans was provided to you by email.
6. The facility is planning to move its business to a new location at 85 Victoria Road in Youngstown, Ohio:
- The facility should obtain a new hazardous waste identification number for the 85 Victoria Road facility.
 - Upon closure of business at the 592 Industrial Road facility: all waste and regulated substances should be removed; and the current hazardous waste identification number should be deactivated.
 - The facility is encouraged to take advantage of the services of Ohio EPA's Office of Compliance Assistance and Pollution Prevention (OCAPP) during this transition.

A copy of the *RCRA Subtitle C Site Identification* form was provided to you during the inspection and may also be obtained from Ohio EPA's website.

7. The following documents were provided to you during the inspection:
- Universal Waste Rules for Handlers of Lamps;
 - Identifying Your Hazardous Waste;
 - CESQG and SQG checklists; and
 - Copy of OAC rule 3745-51-07.

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The following information was provided to you via email:

- OCAPP brochure;
- Information on managing spent aerosol cans; and
- Ohio EPA's hazardous waste generator handbook.
