Dear Mr. Anderson:

I conducted a follow-up inspection of the complaint that open dumping and burning of solid waste is occurring on your property off of Unity Road in Adams County. I conducted an inspection of the property on April 21, 2009. I met with you on this day to discuss the issue. I observed that you are removing the solid wastes that are dumped on your property and into the creek. I observed that you have placed the solid wastes in garbage bags for removal. However, I also observed that you have placed a burning barrel next to the dump site and you are burning some of the solid wastes.

You stated that the wastes were on the property when you purchased the property in 1997. You stated that you would remove and properly dispose of the wastes in the creek and the wastes dumped on the creek bank. Please do not burn the wastes in the burning barrel.

Open dumping and burning of solid waste is a violation of Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Section 3745-27 and 3745-400 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).

Specifically:

ORC 3734.03 - No person shall dispose of solid wastes by open dumping or open burning.

OAC 3745-27-05(C) - No person shall conduct, permit, or allow open dumping. In the event that open dumping is occurring or has occurred at a property, the person responsible for the open dumping, the owner of the property, or the person who allows or allowed open dumping to occur, shall promptly remove and dispose or otherwise manage the solid waste in accordance with Chapter 3734, of the Revised Code, and shall submit verification that the solid waste has been properly managed.

ORC 6111.04(A)(1) - No person shall cause pollution or place or cause to be placed any sewage, sludge, sludge materials, industrial waste, or other wastes in a location where they cause pollution of any waters of the state.

Presently, you are in violation of the above referenced rules.

Open dumping and burning of solid waste must cease immediately. All solid wastes disposed at the described location must be removed from the property and taken to a licensed solid waste disposal facility for proper disposal. Obtain copies of receipts from the landfill that received the waste and provide those copies to this District Office in order to document your compliance. I suggest that you obtain the services of a registered waste hauler to assist you in your waste disposal.

The disposal facilities located nearest to you in Ohio is the Pike Sanitation Landfill at 11775 State Route 220, Waverly, Ohio; the Rumpke Landfill in Georgetown, Ohio; the Portsmouth Exempt Transfer Station, located on Elm Street in Portsmouth, Ohio. You may choose to use other permitted and licensed facilities.

I am requesting that you respond to me at this District Office within ten days of receipt of this letter to notify me of your intentions and actions taken to abate the open dumping.

Compliance with the requirements outlined in this letter, or the solid and infectious waste provisions contained in ORC Chapter 3734 and the rules promulgated thereunder, does not relieve the owner of his obligation to comply with other State and Federal laws and regulations.
