Dear Mr. Shehorn:

On September 21, 2010, Wendy Miller and I conducted a compliance evaluation inspection at Eddie's Collision Center located at 135 West Linfoot Street in Wauseon, Ohio. We inspected Eddie's Collision Center to determine its compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). Pollution prevention options were also discussed during this inspection. This letter will explain the violation we found and what you need to do to correct the violation.

During our visit we spoke with you and Mr. Brad Miller, observed your operations, and reviewed paperwork. Eddie's Collision Center specializes in collision repairs for automobiles and light duty trucks.

Eddie's Collision Center has one paint booth and the filters are changed once a month. The spent paint booth filters are managed as a solid waste. Eddie's Collision Center generates approximately one to two gallons a month of paint waste solvent (D001, D035, F003, F005) which is picked up for disposal by Chemtron. Eddie's Collision Center cleans the paint spray guns using lacquer thinner and adds the spent thinner into a satellite container of waste paint and thinner located in the paint booth area. No used oil is generated at this facility. Spent fluorescent lamps are managed as a solid waste. At the time of our inspection, Eddie's Collision Center was operating as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator (CESQG) of hazardous waste.

We found the following violation of Ohio's hazardous waste laws. In order to correct the violation you must do the following and send me the required information within 30 days of your receipt of this letter:

1. OAC Rule 3745-52-11, Waste Evaluation:

- a) Any person who generates a waste must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste by using generator knowledge or by testing the waste.

At the time of the inspection, Eddie's Collision Center did not have waste evaluation documentation for the spent paint filters. Eddie's Collision Center has historically disposed of this spent material as a non-hazardous waste.

Eddie's Collision Center must immediately cease disposing of the waste paint filters as non-hazardous waste until a proper waste evaluation has been completed.

Eddie's Collision Center must obtain a representative sample of the spent paint booth filter waste stream and have it analyzed for Toxic Characteristic Leaching Procedure (TCLP) Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) metals (SW-846 Method 1311/6010) and volatile organics (SW-846 Method 1311/8260). To abate this violation, Eddie's Collision Center must submit a copy of the analytical results to Ohio EPA. Once analytical results have been reviewed, Ohio EPA will advise you on proper disposal options as well as plans for the future management of this waste stream.

Ohio EPA will review the submitted waste evaluation information and determine if there is a change in Eddie's Collision Center's generator status. Additional violations may be cited based upon your determined generator status. You will be notified of any additional violations in a separate letter.

- b) In addition, Eddie's Collision Center failed to have waste evaluation documentation or an established recycling plan in place for the fluorescent bulbs generated at the facility. Eddie's Collision Center was disposing of their spent fluorescent lamps as solid waste.

Hazardous bulbs are considered "spent materials" and remain hazardous waste even when recycled. Hazardous waste lamp generators have the option of handling their lamps as hazardous waste or as universal waste. Managing hazardous waste lamps under the universal waste rules eases certain regulations imposed on generators of spent lamps.

Please be aware that incandescent, fluorescent, metal halide, neon, high-intensity discharge, high-pressure sodium and mercury-vapor lamps could be hazardous waste when discarded. Fluorescent lamps may contain up to 40 milligrams (mg) of mercury, depending on the brand and manufacturer. Lamps may also contain lead and cadmium. Many lamps exhibit a characteristic of toxicity for heavy metals when disposed. A copy of Fluorescent Lamps: What You Should Know, was given to you at the time of our inspection. I recommend that you review this document and contact me if you have any questions.

Eddie's Collision Center must cease disposing of the spent fluorescent lamps in the solid waste dumpster and submit to Ohio EPA documentation to demonstrate how you plan to properly manage your fluorescent bulbs. If Eddie's Collision Center plans to manage the spent fluorescent bulbs when generated as universal waste, please submit the name of the facility where you plan to recycle the bulbs. Managing the spent fluorescent bulbs as universal waste eliminates the need for analytical testing.

Eddie's Collision Center must also properly train employees, who handle or have responsibility for managing universal waste, on waste handling and emergency procedures relative to their responsibilities and send me documentation (memo or sign-in sheets) that this has been completed.
