Dear Mr. Anderson:

On May 25, 2010, Wendy Miller and I conducted a compliance evaluation inspection of Anderson Tractor Supply, Inc.'s (Anderson Tractor Supply) facility located at 20968 Township Road 51 in Bluffton, Ohio. We inspected Anderson Tractor Supply to determine the facility's compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734. of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745. of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). Our inspection included a tour of the facility as well as a review of facility records. We also helped Anderson Tractor Supply identify ways to prevent pollution by reducing waste the facility generates.

Anderson Tractor Supply is primarily doing business as an agricultural tractor salvage and repair facility. Anderson Tractor Supply sells used tractors and new and used tractor parts. Facility records reviewed during this inspection indicate that Anderson Tractor Supply generates used oil which is either burned on-site in one used oil burner or sent off-site for recycling; used oil filters which are hot drained and disposed as solid waste; spent antifreeze/coolant which is sent off-site for recycling; used tires which are sent off-site for shredding; spent Freon which is captured and reused, spent lead acid batteries which are exchanged for new batteries, and distillation sludge from two parts washers. Anderson Tractor Supply also generates spent fluorescent lamps which are currently managed as solid waste.

I found the following violations of Ohio's hazardous waste laws. In order to correct these violations you must do the following and send me the required information **within 30 days** of your receipt of this letter:

1. **OAC Rule 3745-52-11, Hazardous Waste Determination:** "Any person who generates a waste, as defined in rule 3745-51-02 of the Administrative Code, must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste..."
 - a. Anderson Tractor Supply has failed to evaluate the spent solvent and distillation solids generated from the two parts washers located in the facility service areas. Facility records indicate that Safety Kleen manages the parts washers for Anderson Tractor Supply.

Anderson Tractor Supply purchases approximately 20 gallons of Safety-Kleen Premium Gold solvent once a year. The MSDS for the solvent indicates that it is composed primarily of petroleum distillates, petroleum naphtha, or mineral spirits and has a flash point of 148 degrees Fahrenheit. The solvent is placed into Safety Kleen Model 250 parts washers which contain integrated distillation units. Safety Kleen services that parts washer quarterly and removes the sludge from the parts washer and manages the sludge as a recycled material.

To abate this violation, Anderson Tractor Supply must have a representative sample of the parts washer distillation sludge analyzed total volatile organic compounds (VOC's) and Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) metals using methods as outlined in U.S. EPA's SW-846.

- b. Anderson Tractor Supply has failed to evaluate the spent fluorescent lamps used throughout the facility to determine if they are hazardous waste. Anderson Tractor Supply currently manages the spent lamps as solid waste and disposes of the spent lamps in a solid waste dumpster.

Anderson Tractor Supply must immediately cease disposing of the spent lamps as non-hazardous waste until a proper waste evaluation has been completed. The spent lamps typically contain mercury and other heavy metals which could make them a hazardous waste.

Anderson Tractor Supply has the option of handling spent lamps as hazardous waste or as universal waste. Managing hazardous waste lamps under the universal waste rules eases certain regulations imposed on generators of spent fluorescent lamps.

To abate this violation, Anderson Tractor Supply must choose one of the following options for the spent lamps:

i. Disposal Option:

Anderson Tractor Supply may manage the lamps as a hazardous waste. Anderson Tractor Supply must sample each type and brand of lamp used at the facility for RCRA metals using a Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedure (TCLP) test. Anderson Tractor Supply must ensure that all spent lamps that are determined to be hazardous waste are disposed of at a permitted hazardous waste disposal facility. Anderson Tractor Supply must submit all analytical results to Ohio EPA along with a description of how the spent lamps will be managed or,

ii. Recycling Option:

In lieu of evaluating and disposing of the spent lamps, Anderson Tractor Supply may manage spent lamps as universal waste. Universal waste spent lamps must be stored in a closed and labeled container. This container must be properly labeled with the wording "**Universal Waste Lamp(s)**", "**Waste Lamp(s)**", or "**Used Lamp(s)**". Anderson Tractor Supply must also track the accumulation of the spent lamps to ensure spent lamps are **not stored for greater than 365 days**.

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This can be accomplished with recycling receipts or by marking the container with the accumulation start date (the day the first spent lamp is placed in the container).

No spent lamps were in storage at the time of the inspection.

Ohio EPA recommends that spent lamps be managed as a universal waste and recycled. If Anderson Tractor Supply should choose the recycling option, you should submit to me the name of the recycling facility Anderson Tractor Supply intends to use.

I provided Anderson Tractor Supply with the following fact sheets at the time of the inspection: Universal Waste Rules for Handlers of Lamps, dated June 2005; Fluorescent Lamps: What You Should Know, dated January 2007; and Computer, Fluorescent Lamp and Ballast Recyclers, dated April 2008. These fact sheets are also enclosed

To abate this violation, Anderson Tractor Supply must identify how the facility intends to properly manage the facility's spent lamps. This information should be submitted to my attention at the Ohio EPA within 30 days of receipt of this letter.

As we discussed during the inspection, you may be able to reduce the waste your company generates. If you find ways to recycle, reduce or eliminate the amount of waste that your company generates you may be able to reduce treatment and disposal costs as well as regulatory requirements. During the inspection, I observed potential P2 opportunities associated with your operation(s). **P2 options that you may want to evaluate for this operation include sending your spent used oil filters off-site for recycling of the metal content.**


