Dear Mr. Roberts:

On December 8, 2009, I conducted a compliance evaluation inspection at several building locations of the Kenton City School System. The addresses of the building inspected are stated below. On January 7, 2010, I issued a notice of violation letter (NOV). I did not get any response. On March 18, 2010, I issued a second NOV. Again, I did not get any response. On August 23, 2010, I issued a third and final NOV. On October 4, 2010, I received a response letter. In the letter, you stated that you are planning to manage your spent bulbs as hazardous waste. You also included a copy of the spent bulb management agreement with Graybar, your electrical supplier.

Based on the information you submitted, all the violations discovered during the December 8, 2009, inspection have now been abated as listed below:
