Subject: Failure to Sample Drinking Water for Total Coliforms as Required

Turkeyfoot Inn is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-21 for failure to comply with the total coliform monitoring.

Monitoring Period:	Second Quarter of 2009
Required Coliform Monitoring:	1 per QT
Sample Results Submitted:	Zero

To ensure the safety of drinking water provided by your system monitoring for total coliforms is essential.

ACTION REQUIRED

- 1. Notify the people served by this water system** using one or more of the methods and the timing as required by OAC, Rule 3745-81-32 to reach all persons served.

Timing: As soon as practical, but no later than 30 days after learning of the violation:

- Posting in conspicuous location, such as bulletin boards, restrooms, drinking fountains, vending areas;
- Mail or other direct delivery to each customer;
- Newsletters or newspaper;
- E-mail to employees or students;
- Send to parents or guardians of children at schools or day care facilities;
- Posted notices must remain in place as long as the violation or situation exists, but in no case less than seven days (even if the violation is resolved). The language in italics on the enclosed public notice is mandatory and must be included, as written. Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting with the Ohio EPA beforehand.

- 2. Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to Ohio EPA - SWDO. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.

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If total coliform samples were collected as required, submit the results as soon as possible. The monitoring violation would be rescinded and a reporting violation given for late submittal of the results.

Dear Public Water System Owner:

Turkeyfoot Inn is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) drinking water requirements for failing to monitor and report results of your drinking water during the June 1 to October 31, 2006 monitoring period for the following contaminant(s): Nitrate.

Results received by Ohio EPA indicate that a sample has been collected since the time period listed above. Therefore, Turkeyfoot Inn should continue to sample according to your most recent monitoring schedule.

In order to return to compliance, you must do each of the following:

- 1) Notify the public of the violation using the enclosed instructions and public notice. If you wish to make any changes to the notice, telephone this office for verbal authorization before the public notice is issued.
- 2) **Complete and return the enclosed verification form along with a copy of the public notice to this office.**

Continued noncompliance may result in enforcement actions. To avoid violations, perform all testing as required by your most recent monitoring schedule. Your public water system is responsible for ensuring that test results are reported to Ohio EPA no later than 10 days past the end of the monitoring period. Testing early within the scheduled time period will help your laboratory to complete the analysis and report the results to Ohio EPA within the deadline.
