Dear Ms. Murdock:

On September 8, 2011, I inspected New Mather Metals, Inc., located at 5270 North Detroit, Toledo. The purpose of my visit was to evaluate compliance of the site with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for storm water discharges associated with industrial activity, Facility ID Number 2GR00504. I attempted to contact you by phone prior to my visit. However, the phone number provided in New Mather Metals' permit application was no longer in service. As a result of the inspection, I have the following comments:

According to the Lucas County Auditor's website, ownership of the site was transferred to OmniSource in February 2011. When I stopped by the property, onsite personnel stated that New Mather was no longer operating at this location. This was confirmed by the City of Toledo's Department of Environmental Services. Various roll-off boxes labeled with OmniSource's name were staged around the site.

While the current version of the permit has expired, your coverage remains in effect until Ohio EPA issues a new general permit. Ohio EPA is in the process of renewing the general permit, called the Multi-Sector General Permit (MSGP). The draft MSGP may be viewed at: http://www.epa.ohio.gov/dsw/permits/IndustrialStormWater_draft_GP_oct10.aspx.

Once the general permit is renewed, Ohio EPA will send an application packet to all permittees instructing them on how to renew coverage. You will have 90 days from receipt of these instructions to renew permit coverage. Please be aware that the draft Multi-Sector General Permit will require at least quarterly routine documented inspections of all areas of the facility where industrial activities or materials are exposed to storm water and of all storm water control measures used to comply with this permit. The draft Multi-Sector General Permit will also require at least annual employee training of all employees who work in areas where industrial activities or materials are exposed to storm water, or who are responsible for implementing activities necessary to meet the conditions of this permit (e.g. inspectors, maintenance personnel).


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You may either submit a Notice of Termination (NOT) now to end permit coverage or not submit a permit application when Ohio EPA sends you notification on how to renew permit coverage for this site. The NOT form and instructions can be found at:

Please be aware that if you wish to maintain permit coverage, you need to submit current contact information to us in order to insure that your company receives the permit renewal notification letter. Please include the site's facility ID number in any correspondence.
