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

Dear Ms. McClanahan,

This letter is written as a result of Ohio EPA inspections conducted of the storm sewer slip-lining project within the drainage area of Turkey Run in Columbus, Ohio. The inspections were conducted by Mike Dalton, with Ohio EPA Division of Emergency and Remedial Response (DERR) and myself on December 12, and 13, 2006 respectfully.

Please be aware that Mike Dalton with Ohio EPA received a complaint regarding the discharges associated with these slip-lining operations on December 11, 2006. As a result of his observations, noted discharges of styrene and resins associated with this project were evident in waters of the state, namely Turkey Run. Please understand this is a direct violation of the Ohio Revised Code Chapter 6111.04.

I understand I gave David Parse with Earthtech verbal authorization to discharge this water during the week of December 4, 2006. However, it was my understanding, based on our conversations, that the only potential impact associated with this water was elevated temperature. I evaluated the water quality criteria for Turkey Run and found that your discharge was within an acceptable range for temperature. However, I was assured that styrene and resin discharges associated with this operation would not be an issue.

It is evident based on the observations of Mike Dalton on December 12, 2006, illicit discharges resulted from these operations (see attached photos). **Please note that the Ohio EPA will not authorize future discharges associated with these operations unless specifically authorized under a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit.** All future discharges from these operations must be directed to sanitary, with the permission of the local municipality, or collected to ensure proper disposal.
