Dear Mr. Gunsorek:

On December 4, 2006 a storm water inspection associated with the construction activities of your site located at the corner of State Route 204 and Freedom Way in Pickerington, Ohio. This construction site appears to be approaching one acre of disturbance and may require coverage (in accordance with 40 CFR 122.26) under the General Storm Water Permit Associated with Construction Activities. Please fill out the enclosed Notice of Intent (NOI) form and submit it to the address stated in the filing instruction. Based on my site observations and the conditions of the General Permit, the following items may require attention, provided one acre or more of disturbance:

Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP):

A SWPPP must be developed specific for this site. The plan must address all phases of construction and identify the location and sizing of all sediment and erosion controls. Schedules for temporary and permanent seeding must also be addressed in the SWPPP. This plan must be maintained on site for the agency to review. Be Aware Ohio EPA reserves the right to require modifications to the SWPPP if the minimum conditions of the General Storm Water are not met.


Sediment Controls:

During the inspection I noted the silt fence along the creek had been destroyed (see figure 1). Measures must be taken to reestablish this silt fence.

Erosion Controls:

Given the time of year alternate erosion control measures such as erosion control matting, crimped mulching, mulch with netting and/or tackifier, or an approvable alternative must be implement for this site to ensure effective erosion control for the upcoming winter months.
