Dear Mr. Potochnik:

On September 16, 2008, I visited Solvay Advanced Polymers' (Solvay) facility in Marietta, Ohio and met with you and Jean Anderson to conduct a quarterly review of Solvay's Part B Hazardous Waste Permit. The purpose of this letter is to document my visit and follow up on the issues covered during the visit.

No permit modification items were identified by the quarterly visit.

During the quarterly visit, Jean Anderson and I also walked through the wastewater treatment plant area to view the grading and seeding work that had been done on the Former Equalization Basin's (FEQB) final cover. This work on the FEQB final cover was undertaken by Solvay to correct a violation of Permit Condition G.3 that was identified by Ohio EPA's March 3, 2008 inspection of Solvay. During our walk through, I observed that the vegetative cover on the FEQB was still sparse. In order to properly maintain the final cover as required by Solvay's permit, Solvay must see to it that a healthy vegetative cover is established on the cap. As stated in Ohio EPA's May 12, 2008 letter to Solvay, Solvay will remain in violation of Permit Condition G.3, Post-Closure Procedures and Use of the Property until Ohio EPA has documentation that the condition of the landfill cap has been fully restored.
