Dear Mr. Kozumplik:

On September 25, 2007, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) conducted an inspection of Auto Styles (Facility), located on St Rt 15 in Bryan, Ohio. The purpose of the inspection was to determine how you manage your scrap tires at the Facility. The inspection was conducted in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-60 and OAC Rule 3745-27-61. You were present at the time of inspection. I, along with Mike Reiser, represented Ohio EPA during the inspection.

During the inspection Ohio EPA observed a pile of scrap tires, estimated to be around 1,000 tires, being stored at the back of the building. OAC Rule 3745-27-61(A)(2) states retail tire dealers are exempt from the requirement to register as a scrap tire collection facility provided that tires are sold at retail and no more than one thousand scrap tires are present at any time in an unsecured, uncovered, outdoor location. Your business currently meets this exemption.

However, please be advised that OAC Rule 3745-27-60, which establishes scrap tire storage requirements for entities who are not registered as a scrap tire facility, will apply to your Facility while scrap tires still exist on site. OAC Rule 3745-27-60(B)(6) and (8) regulates the storage of scrap tires outside a building or covered structure.

OAC Rule 3745-27-60(B)(6)(a) states in part: "Individual scrap tire storage piles shall be no greater than two thousand five hundred square feet in basal area..."

OAC Rule 3745-27-60(B)(6)(b) states in part: "Scrap tire storage piles shall not exceed eight feet in height..."

OAC Rule 3745-27-60(B)(6)(c) states: "Scrap tire storage piles of five hundred scrap tires or less shall be at least twenty-five feet away from all buildings and other scrap tire storage piles."

OAC Rule 3745-27-60(B)(6)(d) states: "Scrap tire storage piles of more than five hundred scrap tires shall be separated from other scrap tire storage piles and from buildings and structures by a fire lane with a width equal to or greater than fifty-six feet in accordance with the fire lane chart described in paragraph (F) of rule 3745-27-65 of the Administrative Code."

OAC Rule 3745-27-60(B)(8) states: "One or more of the following shall be done to control mosquitoes at the premises: (a) Remove liquids from scrap tires and immediately store scrap tires such that water does not accumulate in scrap tires or containers. Tires shall be kept free of water at all times. (b) Apply or arrange for the application of a pesticide or larvicide, which is registered for use for mosquito control by the Ohio department of agriculture, at no greater than thirty-day intervals or as recommended by the manufacturer or formulator. If applying any pesticide or larvicide as a mosquito control, then mosquito control records shall be maintained at the premises indicating the name, type, amount used per tire, and EPA registration number of the pesticide or larvicide, the date and time of the application, and the name of the person who applied the pesticide or larvicide. (c) Use another method of mosquito control which is approved by Ohio EPA."

Due to the aforementioned regulations, Auto Styles, is in violation of OAC Rule 3745-27-60(B)(6)(d) and (B)(8) for having a tire pile of more than 500 tires within 56 feet of a building and for failure to control mosquitoes, respectively. Please submit a copy of the shipping paper to Ohio EPA for your next scheduled shipment of scrap tires. You indicated during a phone conversation on September 26, 2007, that a registered scrap tire transporter would be picking up the pile of scrap tires during the first week of October. You further indicated that monthly pickups would be implemented to keep the amount of scrap tires on-site to a minimum. In the mean time, you stated that larvicide will be purchased and applied to the scrap tires to control mosquitoes. Please submit your receipt and date of application to Ohio EPA.

You currently utilize Durbar-Shredder, Ohio EPA registration number 26-STT-003, to transport your scrap tires. You were in possession of scrap tire shipping papers from Durbar-Shredder to verify proper, legal disposal. Please retain all shipping papers for a period of three years.

This correspondence addressed specific observations only for the areas of the property that were inspected. Nothing present in, nor absent from this correspondence is intended to mean that no other violations existed at the property at the time of inspection.
