Dear Mr. Gaskins:

On September 11, 2008, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) conducted a compliance evaluation inspection of Mid-Ohio Collision Center (Mid-Ohio) at 2900 W 4th Street, Mansfield, Ohio. The purpose of the inspection was to determine Mid-Ohio's compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734. of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). Mid-Ohio was represented by George Gaskins, and I represented Ohio EPA.

Mid-Ohio is a body shop that paints vehicles. At the time of inspection, Ohio EPA considered Mid-Ohio a conditionally exempt small quantity generator (CESQG) of hazardous waste due to the fact that they did not produce over 220 pounds (approximately 25-30 gallons) of hazardous waste in a calendar month. Chemtron picks up their paint related waste (F003, F005, D035, D001), used antifreeze and used oil. To date, no fluorescent bulbs have been disposed of since being established at this location. I have enclosed some guidance documents on universal waste for your convenience.

I found the following violation of Ohio's hazardous waste laws.

1. Waste Evaluation, OAC Rule 3745-52-11

Any person who generates a waste must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste by using generator knowledge or by testing the waste.

Mid-Ohio failed to correctly evaluate one 55 gal drum of antifreeze that was picked up by Chemtron that was determined to be flammable (D001). Chemtron filed an unmanifested waste report regarding the one 55-gallon drum of antifreeze (D001) that was sent to Chemtron on June 18, 2008.

Mid-Ohio has only two individuals that paint and are very aware of the protocol regarding where to place the hazardous waste once it is generated. Mr. Gaskins said it is possible that the hazardous waste was placed in the wrong drum but highly unlikely do to their knowledge. Instead, Mr. Gaskins thought it was more likely that a prior employee placed solvent in the drum to cause problems prior to being let go.

Currently, Mid-Ohio has integrated a policy to label all drums so the correct waste is poured into the correct drum. This will help ensure that all wastes are correctly evaluated prior to disposal. This labeling policy went into effect after the unmanifested waste report and was currently being used during the compliance inspection. **Therefore, this violation is abated.**


