Dear Mr. Datillo:

Thank you for your February 18, 2009 response to Ohio EPA's January, 14, 2009 Notice of Violation letter. The documentation you submitted included a map of the facility showing the proposed location of three new "safety cabinets" to be used for storage of "floor dry, shovels, and brooms". My review of this documentation reveals that Chemical Solvents has not abated the violation discovered during the December 23, 2008 inspection and remains in violation as listed below:

1. **OAC Rule 3745-65-52 (E), Content of Contingency Plan:** The contingency plan must include a list of all emergency equipment at the facility, where this equipment is required. This list must be kept up to date. In addition, the contingency plan must include the location and a physical description of each item on the list.

Chemical Solvents remains out of compliance with this rule as follows:

The submittal does not include a list which specifies the amount of emergency equipment being maintained at the facility nor the specific location of this emergency equipment. In addition, the submittal (location map) is not proposed for inclusion in the facility's Part B Permit. In accordance with the Appendix to OAC 3745-50-51, part C.6.b., the Contingency Plan contained in the facility's Part B Permit must be modified to include the emergency equipment locations and a complete equipment list.

To return to compliance, Chemical Solvents must update the contingency plan to specify the amount and specific location of all emergency equipment, including but not limited to fire extinguishers, spill control equipment, and decontamination equipment. In addition, Chemical Solvents will need to submit a Class 1 permit change request for this change to the facility's Contingency Plan.

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Please submit documentation demonstrating abatement of the above outstanding violation to this office **within 30 days** of your receipt of this letter.
