RE: Documentation from Inspection that was Conducted on February 4, 2010

Dear Mr. Albert:

On February 4, 2010, Ralph Fogle of the Coshocton County Health District and I inspected your C&DD facility to determine compliance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-400. At the time of my inspection, it was determined that violations of the aforementioned regulation existed. These violations were verbally expressed to your office directly following my inspection. Please find the specific violations listed below:

VIOLATIONS

- 1) OAC 3745-400-11(B)(1) requires an owner or operator to strictly comply with the license and authorizing documents. Albert's failure to maintain compliance is a violation of this rule.
- 2) OAC 3745-400-11(F)(2) - the owner or operator of a facility shall not dispose of any solid waste except as allowed by this rule. At the time of my inspection, solid waste not authorized by this rule were observed and photographed. The unauthorized solid waste consisted of clothing, toys, magazines, furniture parts, rugs, newspapers, pop bottles and sporting equipment is a violation of this rule. All solid waste must be removed and properly disposed of at a solid waste disposal facility.
- 3) OAC 3745-27-05 prohibits the open dumping of solid waste. At the time of my inspection, solid waste was observed in two separate piles outside of the disposal cell. This is a violation of the aforementioned rule. Please properly dispose of this waste at a licensed solid waste disposal facility.
- 4) OAC 3745-400-11(H)(1) - the owner or operator shall cover all disposed combustible debris on a weekly basis with solid, clean hard fill, or other material which is noncombustible. At the time of inspection, no weekly cover had been applied to any of the disposed of material. This is a violation of the aforementioned rule.

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- 5) OAC 3745-400-11(P)(1) requires that the owner or operator operate the leachate collection system so that no more than one foot of head anywhere on the in situ and/or added geologic material or constructed liner. At the time of the inspection, cell two remained open and leachate was observed above the sand drainage layer and approximately two feet of leachate was observed above the invert of the discharge pipe going into tank number two. This leachate depth appeared to correlate to the amount of leachate observed within the facility. The facility is in violation of the aforementioned rule for failure to operate the leachate collection system to maintain no more than a foot of head.
