RE: INSPECTION OF COSHOCTON LANDFILL

Dear Mr. McCray:

On August 31, 2011, Mark Mansfield and I conducted an inspection of the Coshocton Landfill. During the inspection, I reviewed the facility's daily log of operation and you escorted Mark and I to the working face. After reviewing the facility daily logs, it appears that the facility is in compliance with Ohio regulations regarding the keeping of daily records. However, the facility is in violation of the following:

- **OAC rule 3745-27-19(B)(2)** - The owner or operator shall conduct all construction and operation at a sanitary landfill facility in strict compliance with the applicable authorizing document, including permit to install, a plan approval, an operational report, an approved closure plan, an alteration concurred with in writing by Ohio EPA, or any authorizing document listed in paragraph (I) of rule 3745-27-09 of the Administrative Code. (See *Waste Handling Methods, Section 6 (C)* of Permit to Install No. 06-2076, Issued 2/22/2002.)

A compactor was not being used at the working face. A dozer was being used in place of a compactor. If you would prefer to use the dozer, you will need to submit a modification to your permit to allow for this change in equipment.

- **OAC rule 3745-27-19(E)(7)(e)** - The owner or operator shall ensure that all waste admitted to the sanitary landfill facility is deposited at the working face, spread in layers not more than two feet thick, and compacted to the smallest practical volume. An alternate method may be used if approved in writing by the director.
