Dear Mr. Robinett:

Thank you for sending the photographs and emails in response to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency's (Ohio EPA's) Notices of Violation (NOVs) dated April 26, 2011, July 6, 2011, and August 15, 2011. The documentation was received by Ohio EPA on August 30, 2011, September 17, 2011, and October 13, 2011.

My review of the submitted information reveals that Trinco Auto Service (TAS) has addressed all violations discovered during the April 12, 2011, complaint investigation as outlined below. In an attempt to streamline this letter, details concerning previously abated violations or general concerns which have been addressed in previous correspondence have been omitted.

Violations:

1. **Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-279-22 (D), Used Oil Requirements for Generators:** "Response to releases. Upon detection of a release of used oil to the environment... a generator must perform the following cleanup steps: (1) Stop the release; (2) Contain the released used oil; (3) Clean up and manage properly the released used oil and other materials; and (4) If necessary, repair or replace any leaking used oil storage containers or tanks prior to returning them to service."

TAS failed to clean up and properly manage the used oil in the drum/tote storage area behind the main building.

TAS must immediately begin properly cleaning up used oil releases in a timely manner.

On August 30, 2011, Ohio EPA received photographs that show the used oil contamination in the drum/tote storage area behind the main building has been cleaned up. On October 13, 2011, Ohio EPA received documentation that this material was disposed of at the local landfill as a non-hazardous waste. Therefore, this violation is considered abated on October 13, 2011.

2. **OAC Rule 3745-52-11, Hazardous Waste Determination:** "Any person who generates a waste, as defined in rule 3745-51-02 of the Administrative Code, must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste..."

This violation is considered abated on August 3, 2011.
