





RE: Continued Compliance Evaluation Inspection - OHR000014605

Dear Mr. LaMantia:

On February 4, 2010, Pat Willoughby (Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management) and I conducted a follow up inspection of Multi-Service's Dayton, Ohio facility. Mel Tatman represented Multi-Service during the inspection. The purpose of the inspection was to determine if Multi-Service has shipped any hazardous waste off-site. Multi-Service has not had a hazardous waste shipment since December 14, 2009. According to Mr. Tatman, Multi-Service is working with a company to get the waste profiled and shipped off-site. Mr. Tatman did not know when Multi-Service would have a shipment of hazardous waste. From the January 27, 2010, inspection, Multi-Service had twelve (12) hazardous waste totes and (9) hazardous waste drums exceeding the 90-day storage limit. From the February 4, 2010, inspection, Multi-Service has an additional seven (7) totes and one (1) drum exceeding the 90-day storage limit.

Based on this inspection, Multi-Service continues to be in violation of the following hazardous waste regulations:

- 1. Treatment, storage, and disposal facility Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3734.02(E)(2) and (F) state in part:**
  - (E)(2) No person shall establish or operate a hazardous waste facility for the storage, treatment, or disposal of any hazardous waste, without a hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit issued in accordance with section 3734.05 of the Revised Code.
  - (F) No person shall store, treat, or dispose of hazardous waste identified or listed under this chapter and rules adopted under it, regardless of whether generated on or off the premises where the waste is stored, treated, or disposed of. . . . except at or to any permitted hazardous waste facility.

Multi-Service is illegally storing a total of nineteen (19) hazardous waste totes and ten (10) hazardous waste drums beyond the 90-day storage limit. Therefore, Multi-Service continues to be in violation of ORC 3734.02(E)(2) and (F).

As stated previously, Multi-Service must make every effort to immediately remove all waste that is currently over the 90-day storage limit.

Because Multi-Service has violated ORC 3734.02(E) and (F), Multi-Service is subject to all applicable general facility standards found in OAC Chapters 3745-54 and 55. Additionally, at any time Ohio EPA may assert its right to have Multi-Service begin facility-wide cleanup pursuant to the Corrective Actions process under Ohio law.

Multi-Service also continues to be in violation of ORC Chapter 6111 and OAC rule 3745-42-02 for failing to comply with Multi-Service's July 26, 2005, PTI Special Condition for compliance with the applicable tank standards of OAC rules 3745-66-90 through 3745-66-101.
