Dear Mr. and Mrs. Rouch:

On December 5, 2006, I conducted an inspection of the Greenslopes Landfill. The purpose of my visit was to determine compliance with the April 14, 2003, Director's Final Findings and Orders issued by the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to you for violations at the Greenslopes Landfill. These orders established a compliance schedule by which you could achieve compliance with Ohio Revised Code(ORC) Chapter 3734 and the rules promulgated thereunder.

Order number one required that an explosive gas monitoring plan be submitted within 30 days of the effective date of the Directors Final Findings and Orders. The plan should have been submitted to Ohio EPA by May 14, 2003. As of the date of this letter, no plan has been submitted to Ohio EPA. Therefore, you are in violation of the Director's Final Findings and Order's. An explosive gas monitoring plan must be submitted to the Ohio EPA Southeast District Office as required by the Director's orders. You are also in violation of OAC Rule 3745-27-12(A)(3) for failure to submit an explosive gas monitoring plan.

At the time of my inspection, I observed that discolored water (leachate) that had contacted waste in the landfill was entering waters of the State of Ohio in violation of Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 6111.04. Leachate was observed entering waters of the state below the northeastern slope at the wetlands area. Leachate was further observed running from a drainage ditch along the main access road into a drainage pipe which discharges into water way which runs north of the roadway. You must take action to collect leachate and prevent it from entering waters of the State of Ohio.

Please respond in writing within 15 days indicating the steps you will take to comply with the Directors orders and correct the aforementioned violations. If you have any questions or need any assistance, please feel free to contact me at (740) 380-5435.
