**RE: Pike Sanitation Landfill – September 16, 2010 - Inspection – Notice of Violation**

Dear Mr. Migyanko:

On September 16, 2010, I conducted a partial inspection of the Pike Sanitation Landfill (Pike). I was accompanied by Steve Rine, R.S., Solid Waste Supervisor of this office, and Jeb Lauer, S.I.T., of the Pike County General Health District. We met with Michael V. Migyanko, Pike Sanitation President, Steve Thrasher, facility engineer, and Bob Ison, landfill manager. The purpose of our inspection was to review Pike's daily logs.

As a result of an ongoing audit, Scott Wilson, R.S., Ohio EPA-Central Office, Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM), sent a letter to Pike on August 3, 2010. In his letter, Mr. Wilson identified several violations. Among the violations, it was determined that Pike "does not adequately maintain a daily log for the facility in compliance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-19(E)(10)." Further, it was determined that this failure helped contribute to other violations.

During our inspection, we reviewed Pike's existing system for tracking daily loads and questioned Pike's employees on the subject. No changes to the daily log system had been implemented since Pike received Mr. Wilson's December 3, 2010, letter. Pike continues to send the scale load tickets offsite for tracking by multiple persons at multiple locations. A log is eventually returned to the landfill office at the farmhouse several days later. As noted within Mr. Wilson's letter, this methodology of tracking is not adequate and is in violation of OAC Rule 3745-27-19(E)(10).


Based on our inspection and as described in Mr. Wilson's August 3, 2010, letter, Pike continues to be in violation of OAC Rule 3745-27-190(E)(10). Pike was informed that until a compliant daily log is utilized and kept at the facility, in real time, that the facility continues to accumulate violations of this rule on a daily basis.

In addition to examining the logging system at Pike, we also questioned employees about the process used to determine what materials met the criteria to be classified as exempt waste. Mr. Thrasher indicated that there were only a few existing waste streams that Pike classified as exempt waste. Mr. Thrasher was asked and agreed to provide this office with any and all data used to classify loads as exempt waste at Pike. To date, we have not received any information from Pike on the subject.
