Subject: Inspection of April 3 and 8, 2008

Dear Mr. Kimble:

On April 3 and 8, 2008, I accompanied Mike Chek of the Tuscarawas County Health District on an inspection of the Kimble Sanitary Landfill (KSL). This inspection was conducted to determine compliance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-27 and Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3734. We were accompanied during our inspection by Tyler Fitzgerald of the Kimble Sanitary Landfill (KSL). At the time of our inspection, violations of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 3745-27 were observed.

Please find the specific violations listed below:

VIOLATIONS

1. OAC 3745-27-19 states in part "If leachate outbreak(s) occurs at the sanitary landfill facility, the owner or operator shall repair outbreak(s) and do the following:
 - (a) Contain and properly manage the leachate at the sanitary landfill facility.
 - (b) If necessary, collect and dispose of the leachate in accordance with paragraphs (K)(5) and (K)(6) of this rule.
 - (c) Take action to minimize, control, or eliminate the conditions which contribute to the production of leachate.



At the time of our inspection leachate outbreaks were observed on the northern slope, Eastern slope and southern slope. Leachate was observed to be running into the surface water control structures and migrating off of the limits of waste. A large impoundment of leachate was observed at the northeast corner of the lined area of the landfill. All leachate outside the limits of waste must be properly disposed of as well as all soil that has been in contact with the leachate.

Because the Kimble sanitary landfill failed to properly manage its leachate outbreaks by properly containing and repairing the outbreaks the Kimble Sanitary Landfill is in violation of OAC 3745-27-19 (K) (1) (a) for failure to properly manage leachate. Kimble Sanitary Landfill is further in violation OAC 3745-27-19 (K) (1) (c) for failure to properly control and eliminate the condition that contributed to the leachate outbreaks.

Please respond within 15 days outlining the actions that have been taken to correct the violations and will be taken to keep such violations from reoccurring. If you have any questions, please free to contact me at (740) 380-5435.
