To Whom it May Concern:

This letter is written regarding the storm water inspection that I conducted on October 6, 2011, of the construction activities of Elmont Place along Bixby Road in Groveport, Ohio. The Agency understands that these construction activities are covered under the General Storm Water Permit Associated with Construction Activities. Based on my inspection, the following issues need to be addressed at the site:

Sediment and Erosion Controls:

There were several homes under construction during my inspection. Please install and maintain erosion controls around the new home sites immediately. Also, please stabilize the barren areas since most of the site is at final grade. Please see attached pictures.

Please install and maintain a concrete wash-out pit and insure the concrete drivers are aware of its location.

Please be aware that the General Permit states that all barren areas which remain idle in excess of 21 days must be protected from erosion within seven days of the last earth disturbing activities. In addition, erosion protection must be implemented for all areas of final grade within seven (7) days. Most of the site appeared to be at final grade.

The general contractors will need to complete and submit a construction storm water co-permittee notice of intent application. This application may be obtained at the following weblink: <http://www.epa.state.oh.us/dsw/storm/stormform.aspx>. The general contractors are considered an operator per the construction permit. "Operator" means any party associated with a construction project that meets either of the following two criteria:

1. The party has operational control over construction plans and specifications, including the ability to make modifications to those plans and specifications; or
2. The party has day-to-day operational control of those activities at a project which are necessary to ensure compliance with an SWP3 for the site or other permit conditions (e.g., they are authorized to direct workers at a site to carry out activities required by the SWP3 or comply with other permit conditions). As set forth in Part II.A, there can be more than one operator at a site and under these circumstances, the operators shall be co-permittees.


