Dear Mr. Jabbar:

On January 18, 2012, I performed a hazardous waste inspection of your store to determine its compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws and regulations as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).

Based on the observations and documentation reviewed during the investigation, Ohio EPA has determined your facility is in violation of the following hazardous waste regulation. Please provide the requested information within **fifteen days** of the date of this letter:

- (1) **OAC rule 3745-52-11, Hazardous waste determination:** Any person who generates a waste, as defined in rule 3745-51-02 of the Administrative Code, must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste using the following method...determine if the waste is listed as a hazardous waste in rules 3745-51-30 to 3745-51-35, and then determine whether the waste is identified in rules 3745-51-20 to 3745-51-24 of the Administrative Code by either: (1) Testing the waste according to the methods set forth in rules 3745-51-20 to 3745-51-24 of the Administrative Code, or according to an equivalent method approved by the Region V Administrator of U.S. EPA pursuant to 40 CFR 260.21; or (2) Applying knowledge of the hazardous characteristic of the waste in light of the materials or the processes used.

I understand that spent fluorescent bulbs are disposed with your solid waste. These bulbs must either be evaluated under this rule to determine whether they may be a hazardous waste or they must be managed as a universal waste (please review the

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fluorescent bulb factsheet, attached to this letter). To demonstrate compliance, please provide documentation showing: 1) that these bulbs are or are not hazardous waste, or 2) state that you will begin managing these bulbs as universal waste and provide the name and address of the facility that will have these bulbs properly recycled.
