NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Le Van:

You are hereby notified that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) finds you to be in violation of Ohio's open burning and solid waste regulations. In response to a complaint filed with the agency, an inspection was performed on October 5, 2011. As a result of the inspection, it was determined that open burning of solid waste and other wastes occurred at 3158 County Road 91, Bellefontaine, Ohio, where you were performing demolition work for the Logan County Commissioners.

The violations you have committed include, but are not limited to the following:

- The open burning of solid wastes, including solid wastes made from petroleum products including roofing shingles.
- The open burning of treated wood.
- Open burning in a restricted area within 1000 feet of an occupied dwelling.

The above identified activities are in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-19-03, *Open burning in restricted areas*, and Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 3704.03. In addition, the open burning of solid waste is in violation of OAC rule 3745-27-05(B) and ORC Section 3734.03, and the open burning of demolition debris is in violation of OAC rule 3745-400-04 and ORC Section 3714.02.

You must cease all illegal open burning.

This matter is considered resolved with the issuance of this Notice of Violation. Should you conduct any further illegal open burning, be aware, the case will be sent to our Central Office for further review and possible enforcement action. The Ohio EPA reserves the right,


