Dear Mr. Miller:

Thank you and Mr. Bryon J. Krupp for accompanying me during the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency's (Ohio EPA) February 9, 2010, complaint investigation and subsequent hazardous waste compliance evaluation inspection of Interdyne Corporation (Interdyne) located at the address stated above. The complainant alleged mismanagement of waste. I visited Interdyne to determine the validity of the complaint and to determine its compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734. of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745. of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). This inspection consisted of a facility walkthrough and paperwork review. Pollution prevention options were also discussed during this inspection.

Interdyne provides emergency response to releases of chemicals into the environment to various industrial companies. You also provide containers to facilities and do clean out of air systems, carbon black units, etc. During the inspection, you stated that you do not bring any hazardous waste to your facility. Interdyne generates used oil, used oil filters, spent light bulbs, antifreeze, and shop rags. Used oil is burned in a used oil furnace that heats the 9,000 Building. Used oil filters are properly drained and disposed of as solid waste. Shops rags are laundered off-site and antifreeze is recycled off-site. No hazardous waste is generated on-site.

During the inspection, I found no evidence to substantiate the complaint; therefore, it is dismissed. Furthermore, I found the following violation of Ohio's hazardous waste laws. You abated the violation during my visit; therefore, no further action is required at this time.

1. OAC 3745-279-22 (C)(1) Used oil storage container labeling.

Containers and aboveground tanks used to store used oil at generator facilities shall be labeled or marked clearly with the words "Used Oil."

Interdyne did not label a 6,000-gallon aboveground used oil tank located in the 9,000 Building with the words "Used Oil."

Interdyne abated this violation by labeling the aboveground tank with the words "Used Oil" during the inspection.


As we discussed during the inspection, you may be able to reduce the waste your company generates. I would like for you to consider recycling as scrap metal the used oil filters that you are currently disposing of as solid waste. If you find ways to recycle, reduce or altogether eliminate the amount of waste that your company generates you may be able to reduce your treatment and disposal costs.
