Dear Mr. Vaughn:

Thank you for your December 22, 2006, response to Ohio EPA's November 27, 2006, Notice of Violation/Partial Return to Compliance letter. You submitted the following documentation: Photographic documentation of properly labeled and dated universal waste lamps containers. In addition, you have stated that you have contracted with Vexor to provide you with universal waste removal service. For further information regarding the management of universal waste, refer to the document I provided you during the compliance inspection titled, Universal Waste Rules for Handlers of Lamps, December 2004.

The status of the violations previously cited follows:

1. **OAC Rule 3745-52-11: Waste Evaluation**

Any person who generates a waste, as defined in Rule 3745-51-02 of the administrative code, must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste.

Bilrite has failed to properly evaluate the spent fluorescent bulbs generated at the facility.

On December 22, 2006, Bilrite faxed me a letter indicating that Vexor, Inc. was going to handle their fluorescent light bulbs as universal waste from now on. In addition, Bilrite submitted photographic documentation of the properly labeled universal waste storage containers. Therefore, this violation has been abated.

2. **OAC 3745-279-22(A): Used Oil Storage Requirements for Generators - Labeling**


Containers and aboveground tanks used to store used oil at generator facilities shall be labeled or marked clearly with the words "Used Oil."

Bilrite did not properly label one of the 55-gallon drums that stored used oil. Bilrite labeled the 55-gallon drum with the words "Used Oil" at the time of the inspection.

This violation was abated during the compliance evaluation inspection conducted on October 16, 2006.
