Thank you for your October 4, 2010, and February 4, 2011, responses to Ohio EPA's April 16, 2010, Notice of Violation letter and September 16, 2010, Partial Return to Compliance letter. The documentation you submitted included a copy of analysis of the paint booth filters generated in your auto body shop. The analysis indicates that the spent paint booth filters do not exhibit any hazardous waste characteristics.

My review of this documentation reveals that Warner Automotive has now abated all violations discovered during the April 7, 2010, inspection as listed below.
