Subject: Failure to Monitor Drinking Water

Indian Hills 4H Camp PWS is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code Rule (OAC) 3745-81-23 for failing to monitor your drinking water during the January 1 to March 31, 2011 monitoring period and/or report results for the following contaminants: NITRATE.

A nitrate report was received for a sample collected on April 15, 2011; however, the sample was not taken in the scheduled monitoring period.

In order to return to compliance, Indian Hills 4H Camp must take the following actions:

1. Notify your customers using the enclosed instructions and public notice.
2. Complete and return the enclosed verification form to this office.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements not met for Indian Hills 4H Camp

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the January 1 to March 31, 2011 time period we did not monitor for the following contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time: NITRATE.

What Should I Do?

This notice is to inform you that Indian Hills 4H Camp did not monitor and report results for the presence of the contaminants listed above in the public drinking water system during the January 1 to March 31, 2011 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. You do not need to take any actions in response to this notice.

What Is Being Done?

Upon being notified of this violation, the water supply was required to have the drinking water analyzed for the above mentioned parameters. The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.
