**Subject: Notice of Violation of Failure to Issue Public Education Materials for
Lead Action Level Exceedance**

Dear Sir/Madam:

A review of our records indicates that your public water system incurred a violation of rule 3745-81-85 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) for failure to distribute lead public education information on lead in drinking water to each person served by the Lakeview Elementary School water system by November 29, 2011. The delivery of public education material is required whenever a public water system exceeds the lead action level.

Please note that you are still required to distribute the lead public educational materials within 30 days of receipt of this letter and submit verification of distribution to this office not more than 10 days after distribution. Public education must be distributed every 12 months as long as the water system exceeds the lead action level.

Actions required as a result of the above violation

Step 1	<p>Within 30 days issue the attached public notice of the violation in accordance with rule 3745-81-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code by the following method(s) to reach all persons served by the public water system:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Mail or other direct delivery to each customer; and 2. Any other method reasonably calculated to reach other persons regularly served by the system.
Step 2	Fill out the attached verification form and send along with a copy of the public notification issued within 10 days to the Northeast District Office of the Ohio EPA.
Step 3	Fill out the attached verification form and send along with a copy of the public education materials issued within 10 days to the Northeast District Office of the Ohio EPA.

As a follow up to the plan approval dated August 12, 2011, once the corrosion control treatment equipment was installed and operational, Lakeview Elementary School must successfully complete two 6-month follow up monitoring periods. The 6-month monitoring periods are defined as January-June 2012 and July-December 2012 and will require 10 samples for lead and for copper to be collected. Results must be submitted on the appropriate form to the Ohio EPA Northeast District Office.

Monitoring for orthophosphate concentration must be tested every two weeks. A minimum phosphate concentration of 1 to 2 mg/L (as PO₄) shall be maintained at all times at the plant tap until optimal water quality control parameters (OWQCP) can be determined. Once Ohio EPA receives these reports and two consecutive 6-month sample reports, optimal water quality control parameters (OWQCP) can be determined. Results shall be reported to Ohio EPA Northeast District Office on a monthly basis utilizing appropriate monthly operating reports.
