Dear Ms. Collins:

This letter is notification that the Anchor Fabricators water system is in violation of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) for failure to perform lead and copper routine tap monitoring as specified in OAC 3745-81-80 through OAC 3745-81-89.

This lead and copper routine tap monitoring was required during the July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007 sampling period (see enclosed 2007 monitoring schedule). Ohio EPA records indicate that the Anchor Fabricators water system did not perform lead and copper monitoring during this required period.

In order to avoid any further violations, you must do the following:

Collect and analyze the required number of lead and copper tap samples during January 1, 2008 through June 30, 2008. Based on the reported population of 40, you are required to collect a minimum of five (5) first draw lead and copper tap samples. Report the results on the enclosed forms, EPA 5105, 5106, and 5107 by July 15, 2008. Instructions are enclosed. Please note that Anchor Fabricators is also required to obtain five (5) lead and copper samples between July 1 and December 31, 2008 (see enclosed 2008 monitoring schedule).

Within 30 days of the receipt of this letter, issue the attached public notice of the violation in accordance with OAC 3745-81-32 by the following methods:

Anchor Fabricators
January 23, 2008
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1. Posting of the notice in conspicuous locations throughout the distribution system frequented by persons served by the system; or,
2. Delivering the notice by mail or direct delivery to each customer and service connection.

If posted, the notice shall remain in place for as long as the violation or situation persists, but in no case for less than seven (7) days even if the violation or situation is resolved.

The language in italics on the attached public notice is mandatory and must be followed as written.

**PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR
NONCOMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 3 VIOLATIONS**

The owner or operator of a noncommunity public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than 30 days** after the system learns of the violation, unless the notice is included with the next bill to customers, then the notice shall be distributed no later than 90 days from the date of the violation. Public notice issued by posting shall remain in place as long as the violation or situation persists. Public notice issued by other methods shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
