This letter is notification that the City of Carlisle water system is in violation of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) for failure to perform lead and copper routine tap monitoring as specified in OAC rules 3745-81-80 through 3745-81-89.

This lead and copper routine tap monitoring was required during the June 1-September 30, 2010 sampling period. Ohio EPA records indicate that the City of Carlisle water system did not perform lead and copper monitoring during the required monitoring period.

In order to avoid any further violations, you must do the following:

1. Collect and analyze 20 lead and copper tap samples during the June 1-September 30, ²⁰¹⁰~~2011~~ monitoring period. Based on the reported population of 5,800, you are required to collect a minimum of 20 first draw lead and copper tap samples. Report the lead and copper results on the enclosed forms 5105, 5106, and 5107 and return a copy of the completed report forms to the Southwest District Office of the Ohio EPA by October 10, 2011.

2. **Within 30 days** issue the attached public notice of the violation in accordance with rule 3745-81-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code by the following methods

Mail or other direct delivery to each customer receiving a bill and to other service connections; and if necessary, the system must also use any other method reasonably calculated to reach all persons served by the water system.

Note: Systems opting to include the required public notice in the next water bill have up to 90 days.

The language in italics on the attached public notice is mandatory and must be followed as written.



DRINKING WATER NOTICE

LEAD AND COPPER TAP MONITORING VIOLATION

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the _____ monitoring period we did not complete the required monitoring for lead and copper and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What Should I Do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.

This notice is to inform you that the _____ water system did not monitor and report results of lead and copper in the public drinking water system during the monitoring period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

What is being done?

Upon being notified of this violation, the water supply was required to have the drinking water analyzed for the above mentioned parameters. The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the monitoring period.

**PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR
COMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 3 VIOLATIONS**

The owner or operator of a community public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than 30 days** after the system learns of the violation, unless the notice is included with the next bill to customers, then the notice shall be distributed no later than 90 days from the date of the violation. Public notice issued by posting shall remain in place as long as the violation or situation persists. Public notice issued by other methods shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
