Dear Mr. Wonderly:

Thank you for your January 23, 2012, response to Ohio EPA's December 27, 2011, Notice of Violation letter (NOV). Your response included analytical analysis from the sampling of your facility paint booth filters indicating these filters are a hazardous waste for benzene (D018).

My review of this documentation reveals that Wonderly Collision, LLC has adequately demonstrated abatement of the violations discovered during the December 6, 2011, inspection as listed below:

Paint booth Filters

On January 25, 2012, we spoke via telephone. At this time I told you that your paint booth filters were a hazardous waste (D018) and thus needed to be managed and disposed as such. You stated you will begin to containerize the waste filters and have them picked up and disposed as hazardous waste. In addition, you stated that you will contact the manufacturer of your paint and solvent products to inquire if benzene is a constituent in their products [we did not observe benzene listed on the Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDSs) we looked at during the 12-6-11, hazardous waste compliance evaluation inspection (CEI)].

Request for Additional Information:

1. During the CEI, you stated that you only utilize primers in your paint booths. Where do you conduct your painting and any other type of painting activities (application of clear coats, etc.)? If they are not being conducted in the paint booths, where are they being conducted?


2. Please review the product MSDSs used at your facility. Based on this, compile a list of products you currently use and which products you have utilized in this past. Based on this information, as stated above, contact the manufacturer of both your painting (primers, colors, clear coats) and cleaning products (solvents, thinners) to inquire if they utilize benzene in any of the products you currently utilize or have utilized in the past. Ensure to record this information in writing.
- Please submit to me the information for # 1 and # 2 above within **14 days of receipt** of this letter. I will review this information and based on this information submitted, I will notify you of your compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws in another letter.
