Dear Mr. Smith:

Ed D'Amato and I of the Ohio EPA Division of Hazardous Waste Management conducted an inspection of D and R Auto located at 406 West State Street, Salem, Ohio, on August 20, 2008. The purpose was to investigate a complaint and to determine if D and R Auto had violations of Ohio's hazardous waste and used oil laws as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).

This letter will document any violations and concerns found and outline what you need to do to correct them. A written response to these issues is required within 30 days.

The complaint alleged the dumping of paint thinner and used oil on the property. We saw no evidence of this and you also denied that this has occurred. You showed us the drum you store waste paint thinner in and also the drum you store used oil in. You said that waste paint thinner and air filters from the paint booth are picked up as a hazardous waste by Phillips Environmental out of Michigan. You were not sure where the records of past pick ups were. **Please call Phillips Environmental and obtain a copy of the manifest for the most recent pick up and then send a copy of that to me.** You should keep copies of past disposal records handy.

You showed us the 5-gallon can used inside to initially collect the waste paint thinner. This can had an open funnel in it. You closed the can. Containers of this hazardous waste should be kept closed to avoid evaporation and the resulting employee exposure.

I gave you a list of registered used oil haulers. Please be aware that OAC rule 3745-279-24 requires that used oil generators ensure that their used oil is transported only by transporters who have obtained US EPA identification numbers, unless the generator qualifies for an exemption listed in this rule. A copy of the rule is enclosed. When the used oil is picked up you should receive and retain a receipt showing how much was picked up, by who and on what date. A fact sheet regarding used oil rules was given to you.

OAC rule 3745-279-22(C) requires that containers of used oil be labeled or marked clearly with the words Used Oil. D and R Auto violated this rule by having a drum of used oil that was not labeled as used oil. **Please label this drum and send documentation of that to me.**


