Dear Mr. Smith:

This letter is written in follow-up to a construction storm water inspection conducted by Stephen Riley and Megan Reising of Ohio EPA at Flying Horse Farms located at 5200 State Route 95 Mount Gilead, Ohio on August 05, 2010. The purpose of the inspection was to evaluate compliance with the General Storm Water Permit Associated with Construction Activities. The following was noted:

Sediment and Erosion Control:




Figure 1: Concrete outpouring lacking confining boundaries

- Our staff observed an area of concrete disposal that lacked proper containment (Figure 1). If future onsite disposal is required, containment measures such as a pit impoundment is expected.

Maintenance:

- The sediment controls implemented on this site will require maintenance or reinstallation to ensure a proper functioning condition. This general permit states that all sediment controls will be inspected and maintained every seven days or within 24 hours of a precipitation event equal to or greater than 0.5 inches. A log of inspection must be maintained on site for the agency to review.


