Dear Mr. Bashore:

This letter is written regarding the storm water inspection, I conducted at the Morse Road and Reynoldsburg-New Albany Road Round-a-Bout in Franklin County on June 17, 2010. The Agency understands that these construction activities are currently covered under the General Storm Water Permit Associated with Construction Activities. During the inspection I met with the onsite Franklin County engineer. Based on the site inspection and the General Storm Water Permit, the following items must be addressed:

Sediment Erosion Controls:

- I noted the milling operations associated with the road removal.
- Once earth disturbance activities are underway, the two sediment basins on the east and west end of the project must be installed in a timely manner.
- In accordance with the General Permit, these sediment basins must be installed within seven days from the initial earth disturbance.
- Please ensure the sediment pond addresses the sediment de-watering zone of 67 cubic yards per acre of drainage, in addition to sediment settling zone of 37 cubic yards per acre of disturbance.
