Dear Mr. Cabe:

I am writing this letter in reference to a complaint of dust from a dirt track on your property impacting area neighbors.

On September 8, 2011, I investigated this complaint and attempted to speak to you. You were not at home at the time of my investigation. I left my business card in your front door. I also tried to contact you by phone, but there is no listed phone number for you. An area to the right of your home appeared to be the track that your neighbors complained about.

The dust emissions from the track need to be controlled so that the dust does not impact your neighbors' properties. There are several commonly used options for dust suppressants. These include water, calcium chloride, pine tar emulsions, etc.

Ohio Administrative Code Rule 3745-15-0⁷~~5~~ prohibits air pollution nuisances. The rule reads, in part, the emission into the air from any source whatsoever of dust, dirt or grime in such a manner as to endanger the health, safety or welfare of the public, or causing unreasonable injury or damage to property can be found to be a public nuisance. It shall be unlawful to cause or permit any such public nuisance.
