Dear Permittee:

This letter is written regarding the storm water inspection that I conducted at Washington Environmental C&D Landfill, located in Morrow County, on December 17, 2010. I understand that you are currently covered under the General Storm Water Permit Associated with Construction Activities. Based on the site inspection, the following items must be addressed:

**Sediment and Erosion Controls:**


- During the inspection, I noted the construction of the centralized sediment pond. Please ensure the sediment pond will incorporate the required sediment storage of 67 cubic yards per acre of drainage for the de-watering zone AND 37 cubic yards per acre of disturbance for the sediment settling zone.
- The earthen berm along the southern perimeter of the site is eroding. Corrective measures are expected to stabilize this perimeter berm. Stabilization measures must include re-grading to eliminate the large erosion gulleys noted during the inspection. Stabilization must also include erosion protection measures for the berm. Given the time of year, alternate erosion protection such as crimped mulch, erosion control matting, or equivalent is expected. Corrective measures are expected within 21 days from receipt of this letter.
- It is my understanding that you encountered groundwater infiltration associated with the construction of the sediment-basin. It is highly recommended that a compacted clay liner is installed similar in design to the liner associated with the active area of waste placement to minimize the threat of groundwater contamination and ensure the required volume is maintained.
