Dear Pastor Phillips:

This letter is written in follow up to a construction storm water inspection that I conducted at the House of Blessings Worship Center located at 3633 Big Run South Road on October 27, 2010. The purpose of the inspection was to evaluate compliance with the General Storm Water Permit Associated with Construction Activities. During the inspection, the following was noted:

Sediment and Erosion Controls:

- Most of the site was barren. Be aware the General Permit states that all barren areas including stockpiles which remain idle in excess of 21 days must be protected from erosion within seven days of the last earth disturbing activities. In addition, erosion protection must be implemented for all areas of final grade within seven (7) days. The site appeared to be near final grade, except for the dirt stockpile. Given the time of year alternate erosion control measures such as erosion control matting, crimped mulching, mulch with netting and/or tackifier, or an approvable alternative must be implement for this site to ensure effective erosion control for the upcoming winter months.
