**RE: FRUTH TRUCKING, LLC; NON-NOTIFIER; SUMMIT COUNTY; COMPLAINT #7411
NOTICE OF VIOLATION**

Dear Mr. Fruth:

A complaint was received by the Ohio EPA on March 3, 2011, stating that "*Fruth Trucking, LLC needed to be inspected*". Mr. Almquist and I conducted an inspection on March 8, 2011, in response to the complaint.

We observed violations of Ohio hazardous waste regulations found in Chapters 3745. of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). The following violations and concern were noted. In order to return to compliance, you must send me the requested information within 30 days of the date of this letter.

VIOLATIONS

1. Waste Evaluation - OAC rule 3745-52-11

Any person who generates a waste in the state of Ohio... shall determine if the waste is a listed hazardous waste...

We observed spent fluorescent lamps leaning against the wall on the second floor of the main building. You reported you did not know how the lamps were going to be managed, but that recycling was an option.

Prior to disposal of the lamps, Fruth must determine if the waste lamps would be hazardous waste. The determination can be obtained through chemical analysis of the spent bulbs or generator knowledge. **An alternative would be to manage the lamps as a universal waste which includes containerizing, labeling, and tracking the accumulation time (not to exceed one year).** I have included with this letter information regarding the proper management of universal waste.

Please respond by submitting your written waste determination for this waste stream, or a commitment to manage spent lamps as a universal waste.

2. Used Oil - Container Labeling - OAC rule 3745-279-22 (C)

Containers and above ground tanks used to store used oil at generator facilities shall be labeled or marked clearly with the words, "Used Oil".

We observed a tank in your main building containing used oil. You stated the oil was generated from vehicles on site (as well as from personal vehicles) and was used to run the

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space heater located on the second floor. The tank was not labeled or marked with the words, "Used Oil".

Please **submit photographic documentation** of the labeled or clearly marked tank with the words, "Used Oil".

CONCERNS

1. We observed a few hundred scrap tires scattered throughout the property, but mostly being stored under a canopy in a garage unit outside the main building. I have included for your review an Ohio EPA guidance document entitled, How Do Ohio's Scrap Tire Rules Affect Generators of Scrap Tires as well as a list of facilities that will accept scrap tires.

Please note, I am also copying our Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management on this letter for their appropriate follow up with regard to the scrap tires.

In the same area where the tires were stored, we observed between 15 and 20 metal drums. Those that were checked revealed a few to be partially filled with water. You informed us you intend to send the metal drums off for scrap recycling in the future. I have included contact information for scrap metal recyclers in the recycler list provided.

During the inspection, we suggested receipts be obtained for all transactions such as (1) transportation and disposal/recycling of used oil off site; (2) disposal or recycling of fluorescent lamps; (3) recycling of scrap tires; and (4) recycling of waste batteries. Receipts serve as a record to document how the various materials generated by Fruth were disposed or managed. We suggest they be retained for at least three years from the date of receipt.

We observed numerous wooden pallets on site. The last document referenced above has contact information for facilities that may take and reuse wooden pallets.



 Fruth Trucking LLC began operating sometime in 2009. The facility had been Fruth Sanitation, but was sold. Currently, the company rents out containers, e.g., roll off boxes, and when they are full, brings them back to the facility where the contents are separated out on a concrete pad. Groupings of material such as plastic and glass, scrap metal, solid waste, and asphalt shingles are managed in containers and on the ground. The materials are recycled when appropriate.
