WARNING LETTER

On June 7, 2011, the Troy Fire Department responded to and extinguished a fire on your property at 1315 E. Rusk Road in Staunton Township, Miami County, Ohio, containing a camper trailer, a fiberglass boat and other unidentified materials. On June 14, 2011, the Regional Air Pollution Control Agency (RAPCA) received a complaint from the Troy Fire Department regarding the open burning incident described above. RAPCA then performed an inspection of the premises on June 15, 2011, but was unable to gain access to the property because no one was present at that time. The burn site was located in an unrestricted area. This open burning is in violation of the following state and local air pollution control regulations:

- * Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule: 3745-19-04,
Open Burning in Unrestricted Areas.
- * Miami County Board of Health Local Air Pollution Control Regulations (MCBHLAPCR)
rule: 3745-19-04, **Open Burning in Unrestricted Areas.**

Pursuant to the above regulations, items containing rubber, grease, asphalt or petroleum (such as plastics) and garbage (any matter resulting from food preparation and/or consumption) are strictly prohibited from being burned anywhere in the state of Ohio.

This letter serves as official notification to cease all open burning in violation of the aforementioned regulations. RAPCA strongly recommends that you find an alternate means of waste disposal in the future. Any further violations of the regulations will result in enforcement actions against you which could include criminal and/or civil penalties.
