Dear Mr. Thorud:

This letter is written in regard to a meeting and storm water inspection that I conducted Sunrise Foods, located at 3120 Valleyview Drive, Columbus, Ohio. The inspection was conducted on February 18, 2011, to discuss the need for an industrial storm water permit. Your facility makes frozen Chinese food. The following items were discussed during the inspection:

1. You must immediately apply for an industrial storm water general permit and abide by conditions of the permit. The weblink to the permit is as follows: <http://www.epa.state.oh.us/dsw/storm/stormform.aspx>.
2. Your facility had several uncovered dumpsters that contained food waste, garbage and drums. The dumpsters must have covers and be utilized. Better housekeeping must be conducted to insure all waste materials are disposed of into a dumpster. There was a lot of grease stains around the dumpsters that need to be properly removed.
3. There are waste oil tanks and open containers along the side of the building which have a lot of grease and oil staining on the pavement. This area drains to a storm water drain. There must be better housekeeping in filling/emptying the waste oil tanks and the oil stains need to be cleaned from the pavement. Also, your site has a lot of liter and cigarette butts thrown about the grounds which are discharging to storm water drains. Please prevent litter from being discharged to storm water drains. Please see attached pictures.
4. A storm water pollution prevention plan (SWP3) and a spill prevention plan will need to be developed for this facility. The plans will need to be updated annually or when there is a change in management.
5. There appears to be a vent fan that is not operating properly and is discharging a large amount of grease on to the ground along your building. The grease then flows to a storm water drain. Please provide controls to prevent the grease from being discharged to the storm water drain, i.e., containment and roof over vent fan and oil tank area.
