NOTICE OF VIOLATION – ACTION REQUIRED

Subject: Failure to Sample Drinking Water for Total Coliforms as Required

Dear Sir or Madam:

Chippewa Golf Corp is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-21 for failure to comply with the total coliform monitoring.

Monitoring Period: August 2008
Required Coliform Monitoring: 5 routines the month following a routine positive
Sample Results Submitted: 0

To ensure the safety of drinking water provided by your system monitoring for total coliforms is essential.

As stated in a letter sent August 12, 2008, a routine sample was collected from your facility on July 29, 2008 and determined total coliform positive. OAC Rule 3745-81-21 requires four repeat samples to be collected in a timely fashion and on the same day upon notification of the positive routine sample result(s). Chippewa Golf Corp did not collect the four required repeat samples and therefore are in violation of the OAC. A public notice water use advisory was required to be issued because of this violation. The public notice for the water use advisory must remain in effect until you obtain one complete set of four repeat samples that are determined total coliform negative.

ACTION REQUIRED:

1. **Notify the people served by this water system** using one or more of the methods and the timing as required by OAC, Rule 3745-81-32 to reach all persons served.

Transient or Non-Transient Non-Community	
Timing:	As soon as practical, but no later than 30 days after learning of the violation:
Methods:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Posting in conspicuous location, such as bulletin boards, restrooms, drinking fountains, vending areas; • Mail or other direct delivery to each customer; • Newsletters or newspaper; • E-mail to employees or students; • Send to parents or guardians of children at schools or day care facilities.

Posted notices must remain in place as long as the violation or situation exists, but in no case less than seven days (even if the violation is resolved). Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting with the Ohio EPA beforehand.

- 2. Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to Ohio EPA - Northeast District Office. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.

If total coliform samples were collected as required, submit the results as soon as possible. The monitoring violation would be rescinded and a reporting violation given for late submittal of the results.
