

Dear Mr. Singh:

The Guru Nanak Foundation public water system (PWS) has violated Ohio's safe drinking water laws. Specifically, the PWS has failed to monitor for total coliform bacteria, failed to monitor for nitrate, failed to issue public notice, failed to submit a Bacteria Sample Siting Plan, and failed to submit detailed plans for installed equipment.

Owners or operators of public water systems that fail to comply with Ohio's safe drinking water laws and regulations are subject to civil penalties of up to \$25,000 per day per violation under Ohio Revised Code Section 6109.33.

To resolve your drinking water violations, remain in compliance and avoid possible legal action that could include civil penalties, it is agreed that Guru Nanak Foundation will:

1. Comply with all current and future contaminant monitoring schedules issued by the Director.
2. Comply with total coliform bacteria monitoring and maximum contaminant level (MCL) requirements, in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rules 3745-81-21 and 3745-81-14, respectively.
3. Comply with nitrate monitoring requirements, in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-81-23(B).
4. Within fourteen (14) days of the effective date of this agreement, complete the Bacteria Sample Siting Plan, and submit a copy to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Division of Drinking and Ground Waters, 2110 East Aurora Rd., Twinsburg, OH 44087, Attn: Ursula Musselman.
5. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this agreement, submit detail plans for the Rainsoft equipment that was installed since the last inspection of June 6, 2007, in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-91-02(A), to the Ohio EPA Twinsburg office at the address in item 4.

6. Within fourteen (14) days of the effective date of this agreement, issue public notice for past bacteria and nitrate monitoring violations in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-81-32. Posting must remain up for no less than seven (7) days. Submit a copy of the public notice issued and completed verification form to Ohio EPA, Division of Drinking and Ground Waters, P.O. Box 1049, Columbus, OH 43216, Attn: Katie Hernandez.
7. From the effective date of this agreement, issue public notice for any future violation and submit a copy of the public notice issued and completed verification form to Ohio EPA, in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-81-32.
8. Contract with a certified laboratory for the collection and analysis of total coliform, nitrate, and nitrite samples as outlined on your Ohio EPA monitoring schedule. The contract is to be for at least two years. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this agreement, submit a copy of the completed contract to the Ohio EPA Columbus office at the address in item 6.
