Dear Mr. Daughtery:

Thank you for your November 3, 2011, and March 27, 2012, responses to my August 25, 2011, Notice of Violation letter. You submitted analytical results for the paint booth filters. Your response is adequate to correct the violation as follows:

1. Waste Evaluation, OAC Rule 3745-52-11:

Any person who generates a waste must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste by using generator knowledge or by testing the waste.

At the time of the inspection, Peterbilt did not have waste evaluation documentation for the spent paint filters. Peterbilt has historically disposed of this spent material as a non-hazardous waste. Peterbilt must immediately cease disposing of the waste paint filters as non-hazardous waste until a proper waste evaluation has been completed.

Peterbilt submitted a copy of the analytical results to me on March 27, 2012. These results show that the secondary filter is non-hazardous. The secondary filter may be disposed of as solid waste. If you change painting operations, booth or filter systems, you should have the filters re-evaluated. This violation is considered abated.

Received: Requested Information

- a) You submitted to me a manifest copy of your last shipment of hazardous waste which was in September 2010. **You must be sure you do not accumulate more than 270 gallons of hazardous waste on site in your drums. At the time of our inspection there were at least 4 drums of hazardous waste in storage.**


Storing more than 1000 kilograms of hazardous can change your generator status and make you subject to more regulations. (I have enclosed some information on this).

- b) You indicated on November 3, 2011, that you contacted Environmental Recycling in Bowling Green, Ohio, to recycle your fluorescent lamps. I mailed you a copy of Fluorescent Lamps: What You Should Know with your Notice of Violation letter. If you have any additional information on how to manage lamps, please contact me.

Peterbilt of Northwest Ohio has abated the violation found and provided me with all requested information based on Ohio EPA's August 5, 2011, compliance evaluation inspection. No further action is required.
