

**NOTICE OF VIOLATION – ACTION REQUIRED**

**SUBJECT: VIOLATION OF TOTAL COLIFORM MAXIMUM CONTAMINANT LEVEL (MCL)  
DURING SECOND QUARTER OF 2012 (MONTHLY)**

Dear Mr. Mucciarone:

Fowlers Mill Golf Clubhouse is in violation of the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for Total Coliform established by Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-14. Coliforms are bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful bacteria may be present.

As stated in a letter sent June 19, 2012, a routine sample was collected from your facility on 6/4/2012 and determined total coliform positive. OAC Rule 3745-81-21 requires four repeat samples to be collected in a timely fashion and on the same day upon notification of the positive routine sample result(s). Fowlers Mill Golf Clubhouse did not collect the four required repeat samples and therefore are in violation of the OAC. A public notice water use advisory was required to be issued because of this violation. The public notice for the water use advisory must remain in effect until you obtain one complete set of four repeat samples that are determined total coliform negative.

Fowlers Mill Golf Clubhouse is also in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 3745-81-42 for failure to comply with the Ground Water Rule monitoring requirements.

**To address this violation, return to compliance, and prevent federal enforcement action, the required source water samples must be collected. Failure to collect the required source water sample(s) may result in enforcement action by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA).** If source water (raw) samples were collected as required, submit the results to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office as soon as possible. If raw water sample was not collected, they must still be collected and Ohio EPA must receive result to return to compliance and prevent referring this violation to USEPA.

**ACTION REQUIRED:**

- 1. Investigate and eliminate the cause of bacterial contamination.** Special purpose samples may be collected to investigate the source of contamination or to verify elimination of the problem (these samples cannot be collected to comply with monitoring or MCL requirements; label samples as "special purpose").

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2. **Notify the people served by this water system.** Within 30 days issue the enclosed public notice in accordance with OAC, Rule 3745-81-32 by the following method(s) to reach all persons served.
  - Posting in conspicuous locations, such as bulletin boards, restrooms, drinking fountains, vending areas;
  - Mail or other direct delivery to each customer;
  - Send to parents or guardians of children at schools or day care facilities E-mail, newsletters or newspaper;
  - Posted notices must remain in place for as long as the violation exists, but in no case for less than seven days (even if the violation is resolved). The language in italics on the enclosed public notice is mandatory and must be included, as written. Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting with Ohio EPA beforehand.
3. **Complete the enclosed verification form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to Ohio EPA - NEDO. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.
4. **Collect a set of four (4) repeat samples, until one set is total coliform-negative to discontinue the Water Use Advisory.** Notify the people served by the water system when the water use advisory is discontinued.
5. **Collect a raw sample from each well in operation, or one raw sample representative of the wells, at the time the positive sample was collected.** The sample should be labeled a "Special Purpose" and marked as GWR001.
6. **Monitor with at least five (5) routine samples** in the month following a routine total coliform-positive result in accordance with OAC, Rule 3745-81-21(B)(7).

# PUBLIC NOTICE - DRINKING WATER WARNING

## Tests show coliform bacteria in Fowlers Mill Golf Clubhouse water

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. We took \_\_\_\_\_ [number] samples for coliform bacteria during \_\_\_\_\_ [month and year]. \_\_\_\_\_ [Number/percentage] of those samples showed the presence of coliform bacteria. No more than [1 sample per month/5 percent of our samples] may show the presence of coliform bacteria during a month.

We were required to collect four repeat samples within 24 hours of notification of any total coliform positive result to determine if *E. coli* or fecal coliform bacteria were present. These bacteria can make you sick, and are a particular concern for people with weakened immune systems. We did not collect four required repeat samples for a total coliform positive result taken on 6/4/2012, and therefore required to go on a boil order alert until four total coliform negative results are obtained.

### What should I do?

- **DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST.** Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for at least one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.
- Total coliform bacteria are generally not harmful themselves. Usually, coliforms are a sign that there could be a problem with the systems treatment or distribution systems.
- Coliforms are bacteria which are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.

### What is being done?

We are still detecting coliform bacteria. We are investigating and taking the necessary steps to correct the problem as soon as possible.

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**PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR  
NON COMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 2 VIOLATIONS**

The owner or operator of a non-community public water system with a Tier 2 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than 30 days** after the system learns of the violation. Public notice shall be repeated every 3 months as long as the violation or situation persists.
